## WEBSITE EVALUATION FORM

When using a website to get factual information, it is important to know whether the information on the website is reliable. These are some general questions you can ask yourself while looking at a website as a reference. You may not find answers for every single question, but you should be able to answer at least one question per category. The "About Us" section is usually a great place to look.

<b>WHO</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Who wrote the pages and are they an expert?</li><li>Is a biography of the author included?</li><li>How can I find out more about the author?</li></ul>	
<b>WHAT</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>What does the author say about the purpose of the site?</li><li>What else might the author have in mind for the site?</li><li>What makes the site easy to use?</li><li>What information is included and does this information differ from other sites?</li></ul>	
<b>WHEN</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>When was the site created?</li><li>When was this site last updated?</li></ul>	
<b>WHERE</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Where does the information come from?</li><li>Is there a sponsor?</li><li>Where can I look to find out more about the sponsor of</li></ul>	
<b>WHY</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Why is this information useful to my purpose?</li><li>Why should I use this information?</li><li>Why is this page better than another?</li></ul>
